




Dear Students!


Universal values in 'Hamlet'

Last year my class went to the cinema to watch one of the most popular theatre plays 'Hamlet' by William Shakespeare, staged at a theatre in London. To sum up, I think it was one of the best theatre plays which I watched in my life and I hope I will watch and read more Shakespeare.




Is 'Macbeth' timeless?
